

## ELISABETH “LIS” C. FROST

Lis Frost is a partner in Perkins Coie’s Political Law Group and has extensive experience representing voters, campaigns, political committees and others with an interest in the political process in state and federal courts. She has successfully litigated cases involving redistricting, voting rights and campaign finance, as well as those implicating important matters of First Amendment speech and association.

Several cases that Lis has worked on have been considered or heard by the U.S. Supreme Court. In 2016 alone, Lis was a member of the teams that successfully briefed and argued three redistricting cases that the Court considered that term: *Wittman v. Personhuballah*, *Bethune-Hill v. Virginia State Board of Elections*, and *McCrorry v. Harris*. Lis also has experience litigating redistricting matters at the trial level and was part of both the trial and appellate teams in the case of *Romo v. Detzner*, obtaining a historic ruling that Florida’s 2011 congressional map was an impermissible political gerrymander, in violation of the state constitution.

Lis also has considerable experience successfully challenging repressive voting measures that make it more difficult for eligible voters to participate in the franchise. In the 2018 election cycle, Lis was the lead attorney in a voting rights matter challenging the Florida Secretary of State’s restrictive interpretation of the state’s early voting requirement, which the Secretary claimed prohibited placing early voting sites on college and university campuses. Lis obtained a preliminary injunction restraining the Secretary from enforcing that interpretation and, as a result, over 10 Florida schools offered early voting on campus for the first time in the 2018 November election, and over 57,000 voters cast ballots at those locations, none of which would have existed but for the injunction.
