Susan E. Huhta is the managing partner of Outten & Golden's Washington, D.C. office, where she heads the firm's individual practice group in D.C. She co-chairs the firm's Discrimination and Retaliation Practice Group and has represented employees in a wide range of employment matters, including litigation in state and federal trial and appellate courts, for over 20 years.

Ms. Huhta also provides advice and counseling to individuals experiencing employment problems or disputes, including executives and lawyers, and she negotiates employment contracts, as well as non-compete, bonus, change of control, separation and severance agreements.
