Changing How We Show Up

Meetings and conversations between lawyers these days typically take place virtually, using Zoom, cameras, and microphones to connect. Nevertheless, the latest and first <u>Basic Training & Beyond</u> of 2023 took place exclusively in-person for the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, which noticeably added more opportunity for participation and collaboration.

If you run your own law practice, you've undoubtedly noticed some of these differences when working with clients and staff remotely instead of in person.
